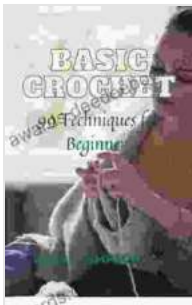


Basic Crochet 99 Techniques for Beginners: A Comprehensive Guide to Mastering the Basics
