The Cat in the Hat



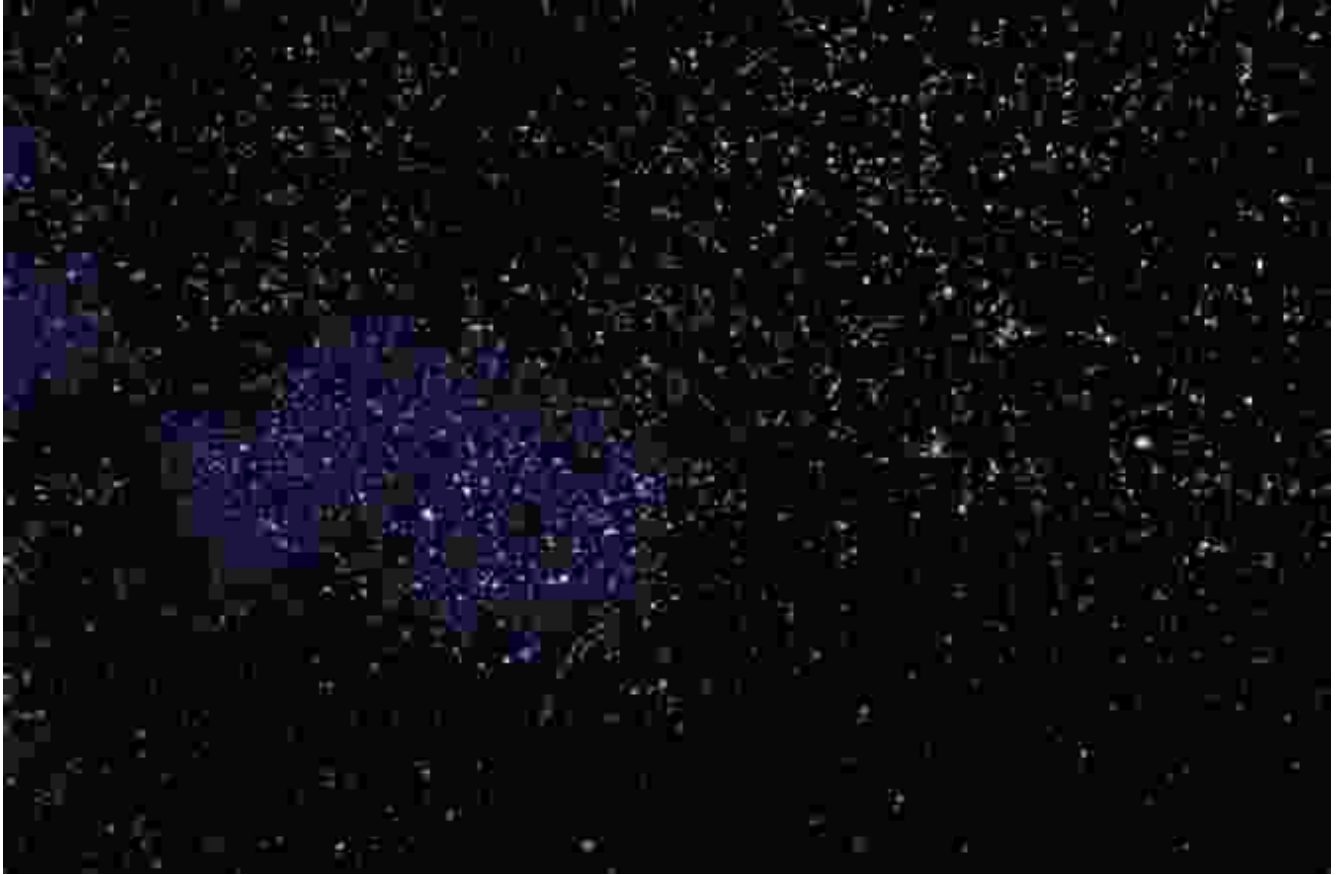
The cat sat on the mat, With a hat on his head and a grin like a cat. He said, "I'm here to play, So come on, let's play today!"
