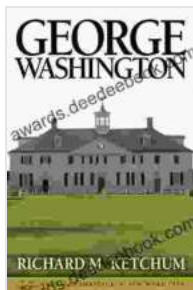


George Washington: A Timeless Icon in American History

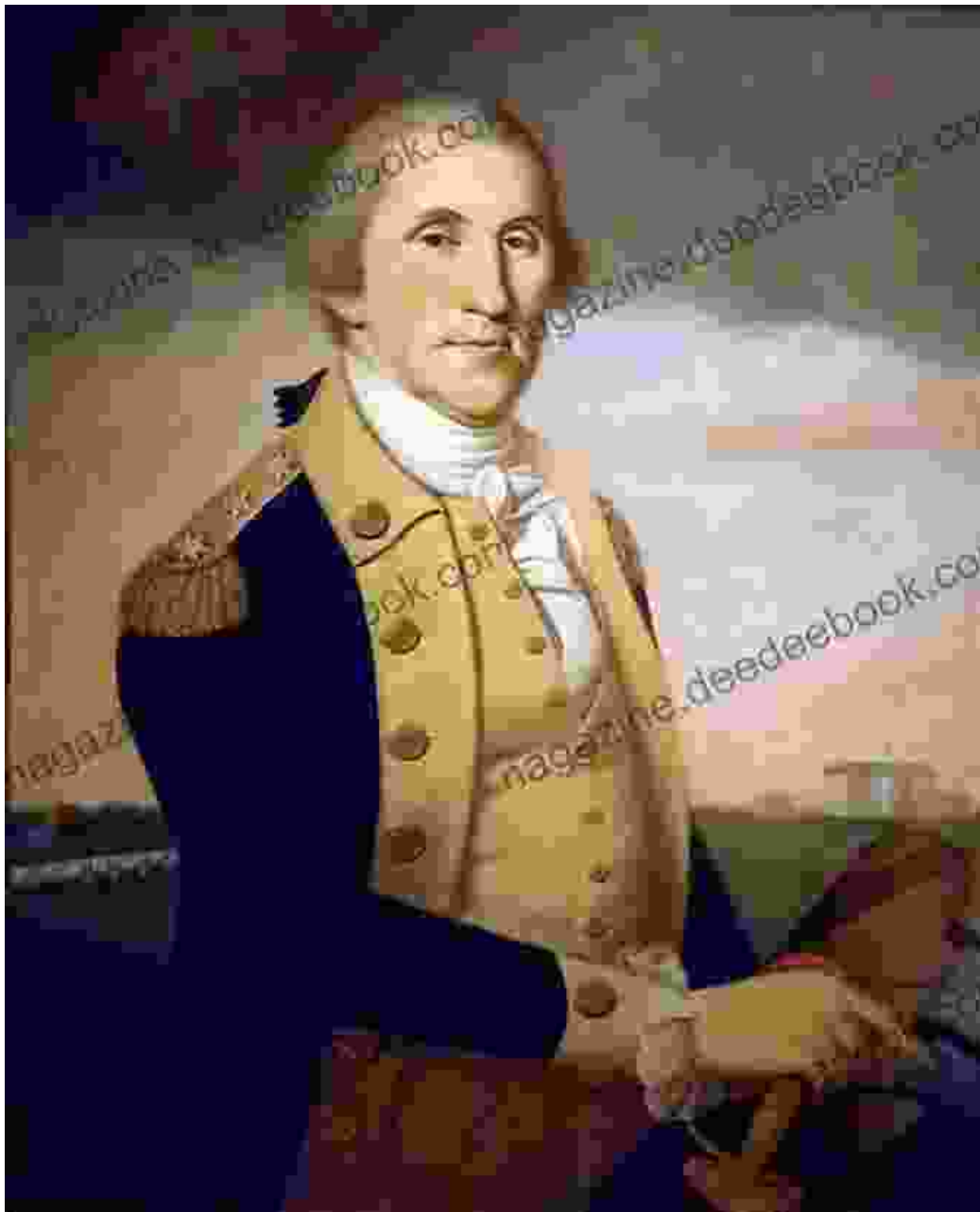
