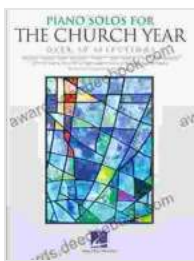

Tips for Performance

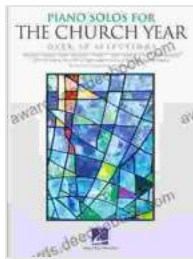
Here are a few tips for performing the solos in the Piano Solos for the Church Year Songbook:
