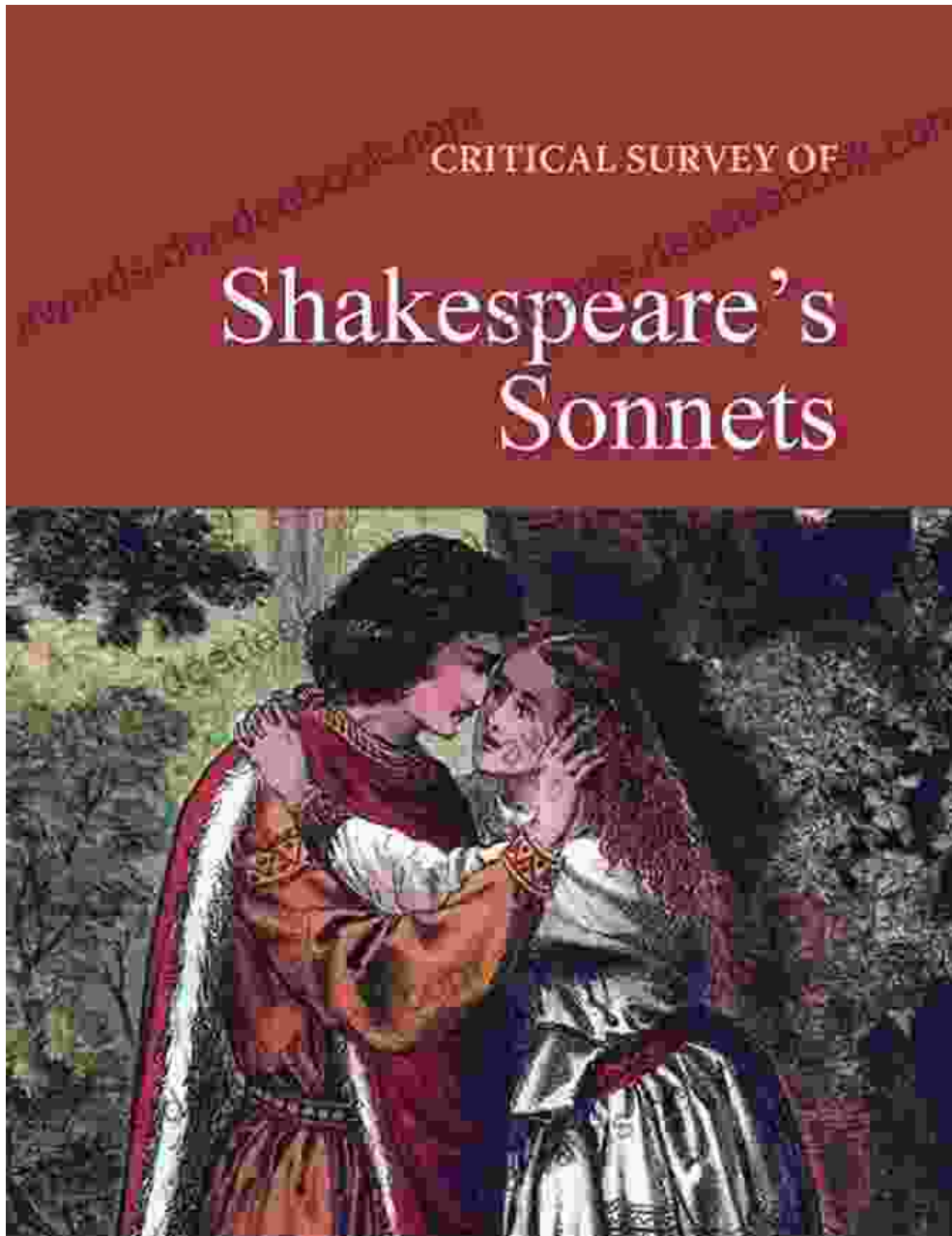

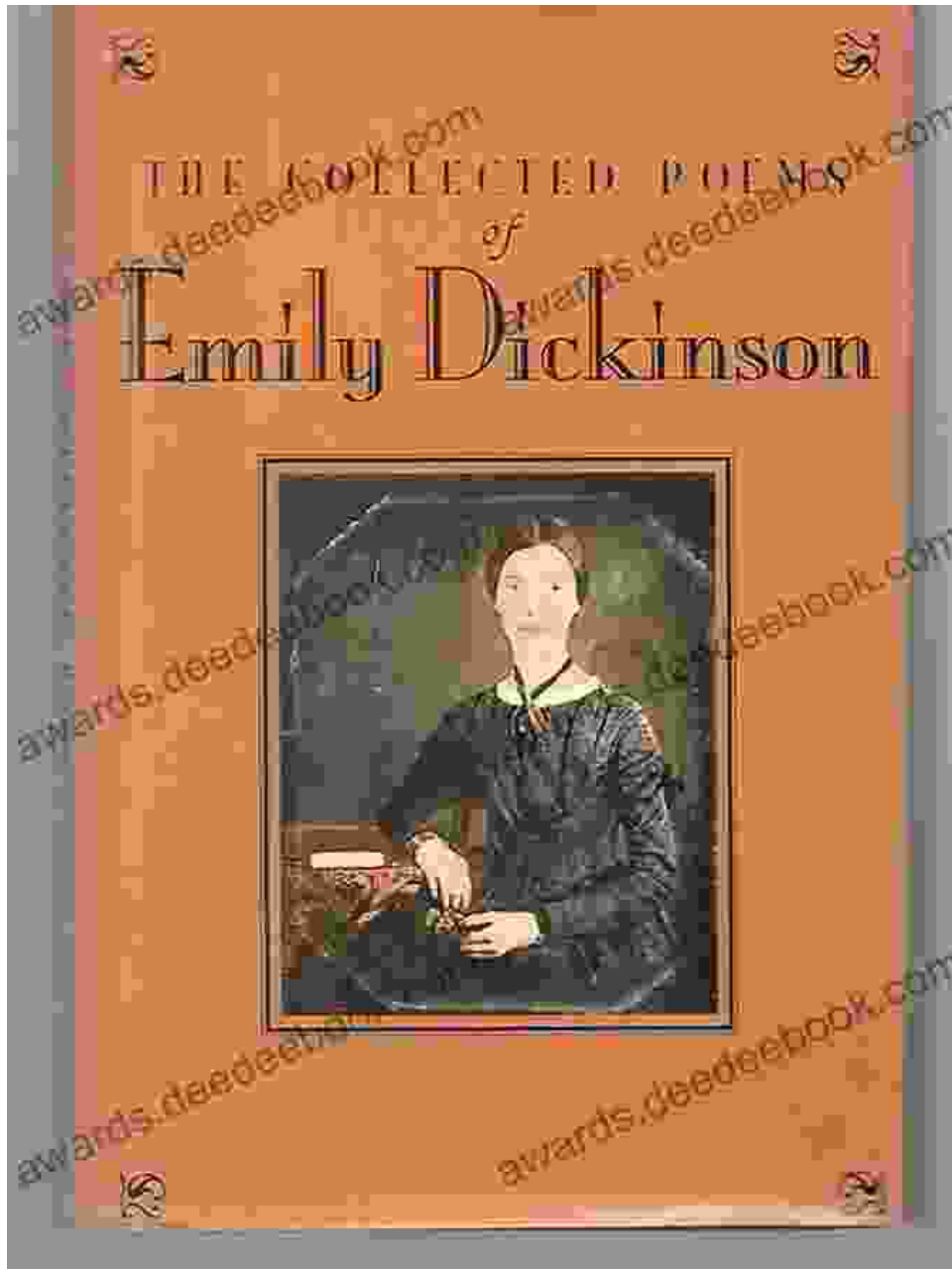

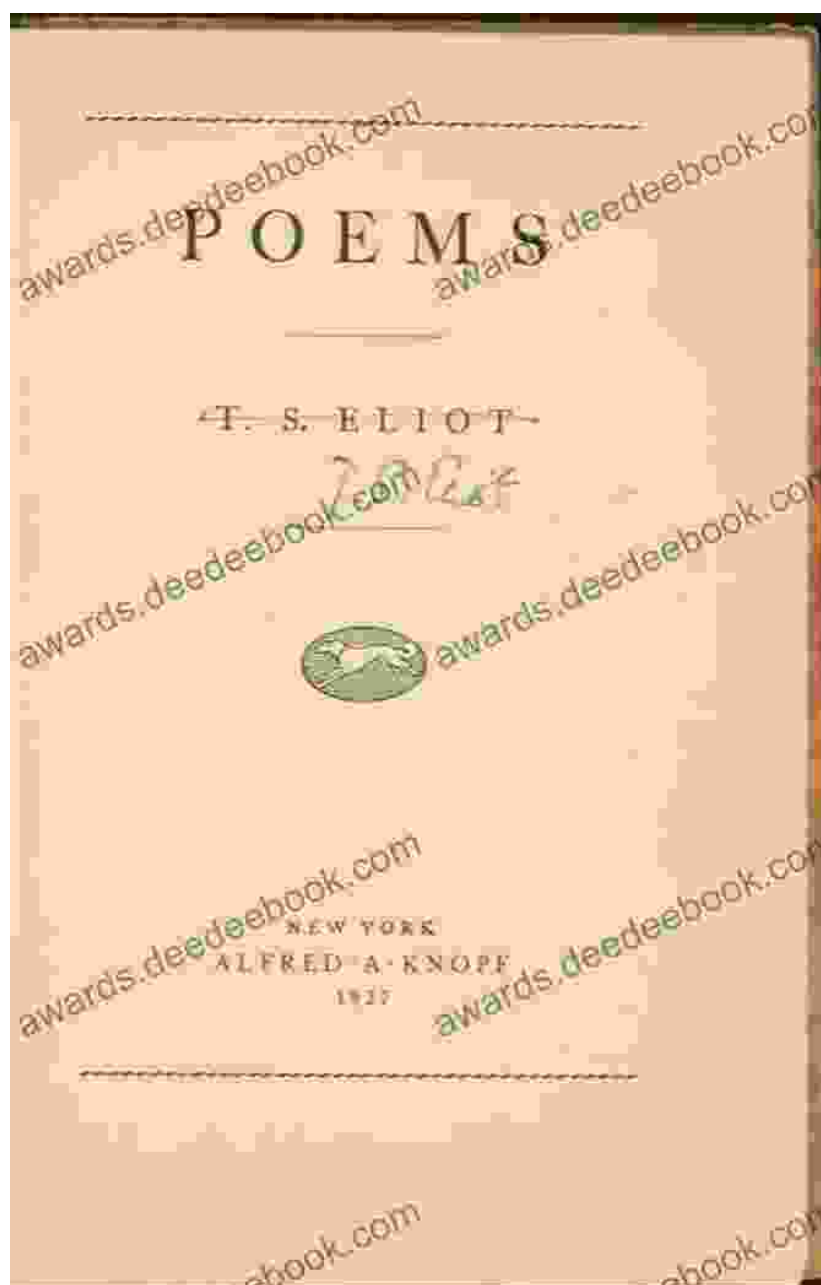
I've watched you now a full half-hour,
