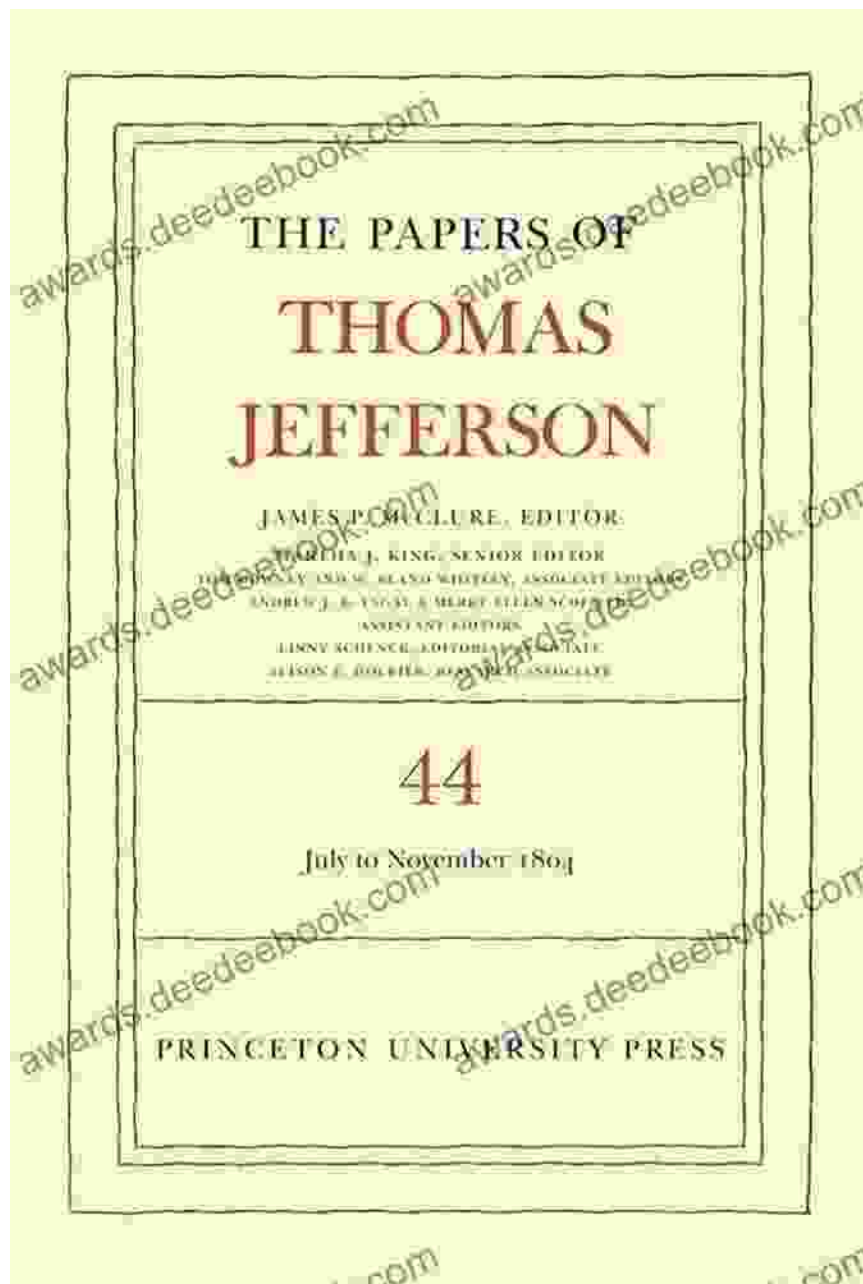
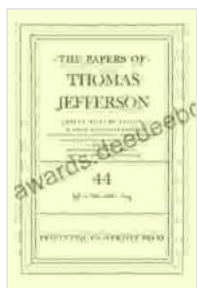


The Papers of Thomas Jefferson: Volume 44

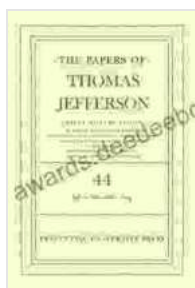
Significance
